## What to do within the first few days

 Inform your school of origin about your arrival.
 They are waiting to hear from you. 2. Participate of one of the welcoming informative events. You will be informed promptly. To the event you must bring: your Student Visa stamped on your passport and the health insurance required for your stay..

Don't forget to bring your passport with the Chilean visa stamped. You have to provide, as well, a printed copy of your health insurance.

3. You will have to go to the office of the career or program that you chose. They will help you to select your courses.



# **NECESSARY DOCUMENT**

## How to legalise your stay in Chile

#### VISA REGISTRY

Every foreign student that wants to study in Chile must obtain a student visa. This visa does not allow you to carry out any type of paid activity. To obtain the visa, you will have to begin the procedure at the Chilean Consulate in your country of origin and arrive in Chile with your permit already issued.

Students have 30 days upon arrival in Chile to validate the visa at the National Immigration Affair Headquarters (Jefatura Nacional de Extranjería) and International Police (Policía Internacional). You will receive the Visa Registry Certificate, which is the document that allows you to obtain a Chilean Identity Card.

#### **IDENTITY CARD**

To get your Chilean Identity Card you have to go to the closest Civil Registry and Identification Service Office (Servicio de Registro Civil e Identificación) with your Visa Registry Certificate.

#### TNE - NATIONAL STUDENT CARD

This card allows regular students to receive a discount on public transport. To be eligible for this benefit you must be a regular student enrolled in an undergraduate program officially recognised by the Ministry of Education and have a Chilean RUN, a unique identity number. To apply you have to go to the TNE Office located in the "Patio de los Naranjos" (Orange Trees Courtyard" inside the school campus. You will received further information during the welcoming informative event.

#### What do you need?

- 1. Photocopy of the enrolment of the current semester or a Regular Student Certificate
- 2. Make a deposit in Banco Santander, for the amount indicated in the USACH TNE Office. Account N° 19.03590-8 in the school's name.
- 3. Photocopy of your Chilean Identity Card
- 4. The picture is taken in the place and on the date indicated by the person in charge of the USACH School Pass.



At the Universidad de Santiago de Chile, a credit is a value unit equivalent to one class period (45 minutes) for an academic period, based on activities of every type; theoretical, laboratory activities, workshops, among others.

The cost per credit for visiting students (those that conduct mobility in an independent way, outside an agreement or network) is US100 per hour/credit.



## A country turned into a City

Santiago is the capital city of Chile and the Metropolitan Region. Its "big city" nature makes it a place which offers a complete experience, from the modernity of its buildings, to the historical combination of popular neighbourhoods, which bring with them the best of Chile's culture and traditions.

Since it is a deep valley, it is surrounded by mountains, which offer exciting activities in ski resorts during winter, as well as extreme sports opportunities, such as trekking and climbing surrounded by nature in Cajón del Maipo.

Since it is located in the middle, Santiago is only a couple of hours away from the coast, so Valparaíso, Viña del Mar and other coastal destinations such as San Antonio, Rocas de Santo Domingo and Isla Negra are readily available.

#### **UNMISSABLE LOCATIONS IN SANTIAGO**



#### Historical Centre of Santiago

It is the area with the most historical heritage in the city. Plaza de Armas, --the city's main square- and its surroundings, hide on every corner the history of Chile. Old buildings such as the Town Hall of Santiago, the Cathedral of Santiago, the National Historical Museum, Courts of Law, among others, are part of the historical route, along with the classic Paseo Ahumada.



#### Sky Costanera

Inaugurated in 2015, Sky Costanera offers a 360° view of the city at 300 meters (almost 1,000 feet), at the 61st and 62nd floor. This viewpoint has turned into a must visit destination, not only for tourists, but also for those who love the Metropolitan Capital and fantastic sky-high views. It is all ages friendly and there is also a 4,000 CLP discount fare for students.



#### Traditional neighbourhoods

From cultural mazes, art outdoors, bohemian streets famous for their night displays, to corners where everything can be found; traditional cuisine, authentic products, antiques and avant-garde displays. All of this can be found in Lastarria-Bellas Artes, Italia and Bellavista neighbourhoods.



#### Santiago Metropolitan Park

It is the biggest urban park in the city with an area of 712 hectares (1,759 acres) divided in the San Cristóbal, Blanco, Chascarillas, Pirámide and the El Bosque Santiago hills. It is made up of big green areas, picnic zones, viewpoints, pools, the National Zoo and the iconic Virgin of the Immaculate Conception in the top of the San Cristóbal hill.



#### Parque Cordillera Association Network

It is a network which offers visitors the opportunity to follow more than 110 Km (68 miles) of paths, made up of five mountain range natural parks; Parque Puente Ñilhue (Lo Barnechea), Parque San Carlos de Apoquindo (Las Condes), Parque Aguas de Ramón (La Reina-Las Condes), Parque Cantalao (Peñalolén), and Parque Quebrada de Macul (Macul).



## Santiago's mass transport system

#### **Transantiago**

Santiago's public transport system (Transantiago) includes all the public transport buses in the city, both physically and in terms of fees, operated by seven licenced companies, as well as the Metro de Santiago and, the recently added, Tren Central (Metro Tren).

#### **Fare**


Adult: 700 CLP-780 CLP (around 1USD) depending whether on rush hours or

#### **Payment System**


The payment is made with a BIP Card or TNE (National Student Card), which are refilled at BIP! points or in refilling centres located at subway/underground stations and other associated stores.



#### Metro de Santiago

Metro de Santiago is the metropolitan subway/underground. Its network covers large parts of the city. It is one of the most modern systems in Latin America, transporting around 2,500,000 passengers daily. It has seven main lines; Line 1 (Red), Line 2 (Yellow), Line 4 (Blue), Line 4A (Light-blue), Line 5 (Green), Line 6 (Purple), and the recently inaugurated Line 3 (Brown).
