Our summer schools

Arts, Activism and Social Justice

Explore the intersections of arts, activism and social justice. Delivered both on campus and by community-based partners in the thriving arts and voluntary sectors of Bristol, this programme takes you beyond the classroom as you learn from the people who are shaping our community.

You'll investigate how literature, music, visual arts, poetry and storytelling, dance, philosophy and critical social theories have shaped movements for social justice across the globe, with particular attention given to racial justice and the legacies of slavery.

This programme is suited to undergraduate students who are community leaders and activists. We welcome students from any major who are interested in understanding the context for change in their home communities and learning the tools to influence this.

The field school will help you develop your anthropological and archaeological excavation techniques, supervised by our expert staff, in a way that makes constant reference to the historical and geographical landscape.

What's included

The fee for our summer schools includes all tuition, accommodation, the majority of your meals, day trips and social activities. Where relevant, it also includes on-site learning or industry visits. You'll need to cover your travel to Bristol, travel or medical insurance, visa costs and personal spending money.

You'll stay in a single room with access to a 24/7 duty team. Your dedicated student mentor will help you settle in and support you throughout your time here.

Additional requirements

To apply for one of these programmes, you must be 18 years or older and currently studying an undergraduate degree. You may be asked to provide proof of your English language ability.
